

Market share of 6 major commodities of Viet Nam in the EU




Looking back at 3 years of implementing the EVFTA Agreement

3 EU INVESTMENT IN VIET NAM

- EU is the 6th largest foreign investor in Viet Nam with 2,540 project and a total registered capital of 29.24 billion USD, accumulated as of the end of October 2023 (Ministry of Planning & Investment of Viet Nam).
- ► FDI from the EU spans across 18/21 economic sectors and 52/63 provinces in Viet Nam, with a focus on processing & manufacturing industries; production & distribution of electricity and gas; real estate and media information.






Export and import share of major EU partners in 2022

According to Eurostat, Viet Nam is currently the 16th largest trading partner, and the largest trading partner of the EU in ASEAN, with two-way trade turnover in 2022 reaching 64.21 billion EUR, up 30.53% compared to 2021.

Viet Nam ranks 11th among the extra-EU suppliers to the EU (2022) with a market share of 1.7%.
